Physical Resources

- 4 classroom blocks (14 classrooms) 3 of the classroom blocks were built in 2005 and the 4th (consisting of 2 classrooms, a performing arts room and an enviro-kitchen and 2 withdrawal spaces) was moved onto the site from Harley Street school and is approximately 50 years old. This block was extensively renovated during 2010 and brought up to the standard of the rest of the school.

Professional Development

Areas of professional development that have been covered this year by staff include, Numeracy, ETAP, Administration, ICT use in the classrooms, Literacy, Physical Education, Student Behaviour, PB4L, STEM (Science, technology, engineering and maths), Future Focused Teaching & Learning, Culturally Responsive Practice, EFS and other curriculum – specific short courses.

Special Needs

The Resource Teachers of Learning and Behaviour worked with a number of students in the school in both the Reading/language areas and in managing behaviours in the classrooms. Teacher Aides provided teachers with assistance for ORS students and provided teachers with extra in-class assistance for groups of students who had learning needs at regular times each week. The SWEEP programme was introduced to cater for enrichment and extension for a group of students in Year 5 & 6. The Perceptual Motor Programme (PMP) was run throughout the Junior Syndicate for the twelfth year.
