Matariki is the Maori New Year. It is the Maori name for a group of seven stars known as the Pleiades star cluster that become visible in our night sky around June each year. Some people think of Matariki as a mother star with six daughters and it is often referred to as the Seven Sisters. It is this story that we will be referring to for our Whanau Day activities this year. Classes will learn about the different stars of Matariki, and what each one represents.

Children will be participating in a variety of activities: making bird feeders, bug hotels, kites, flax weaving, rain sticks, making digital books about grandparents. Loads of fun so come along and join us.
