Once upon a time there were three little Billy Goats. They ran out of grass.

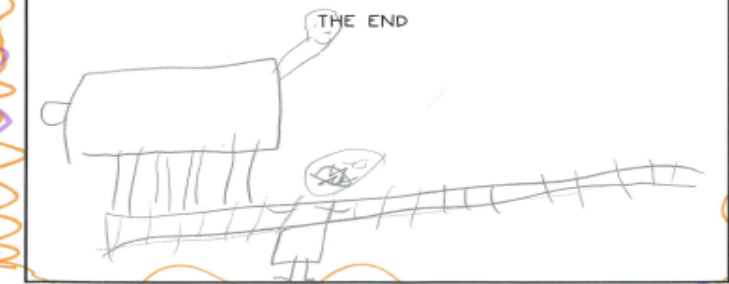
They had no grass, so they were very hungry. But they saw a meadow and it looked very yummy, and their mouths watered because it looked so yummy!
