Auckland moves to Alert Level 3 from 11:59pm Tuesday, September 21

Alert level 3: Auckland

- Stay at home in your bubble
- Wear a mask and maintain social distancing of 2m if you do go outside
- You can leave your home to:
 - Shop for essential goods
 - Exercise in your neighbourhood
 - Receive necessary medical care
 - Get a Covid test

Alert level 2: Rest of NZ

- Get a Covid test if you experience cold or flu symptoms
- Face coverings mandatory inside indoor venues, on public transport and flights
- Indoor venues limited to 100 people
- Outdoor venues limited to 100 people
- Maintain social distancing of 2m in gyms, museums and libraries

Mandatory record-keeping came into effect from 11.59pm Wednesday, September 7

COVID-19 Community Fund

The 2020 COVID-19 lockdown had a disproportionate effect on women and girls in Aotearoa, including job losses, increased caring work and increased family violence.

Community organizations play a vital role in supporting women and girls at the grassroots in our community. COVID-19 can affect the services these organizations provide to local communities, so in order to support organizations to continue to support acute and immediate needs, the Minister for Women, Hon Jan Tinetti, announced a new COVID-19 Community Fund for 2021.

The \$2 million COVID-19 Community Fund is for community organizations that support women and girls in Aotearoa New Zealand and are facing significantly increased demand for their services and/or decreased resources as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic.

The Government is prioritizing grassroots investments to ensure funds are spent to improve outcomes for women, and where they are needed most.

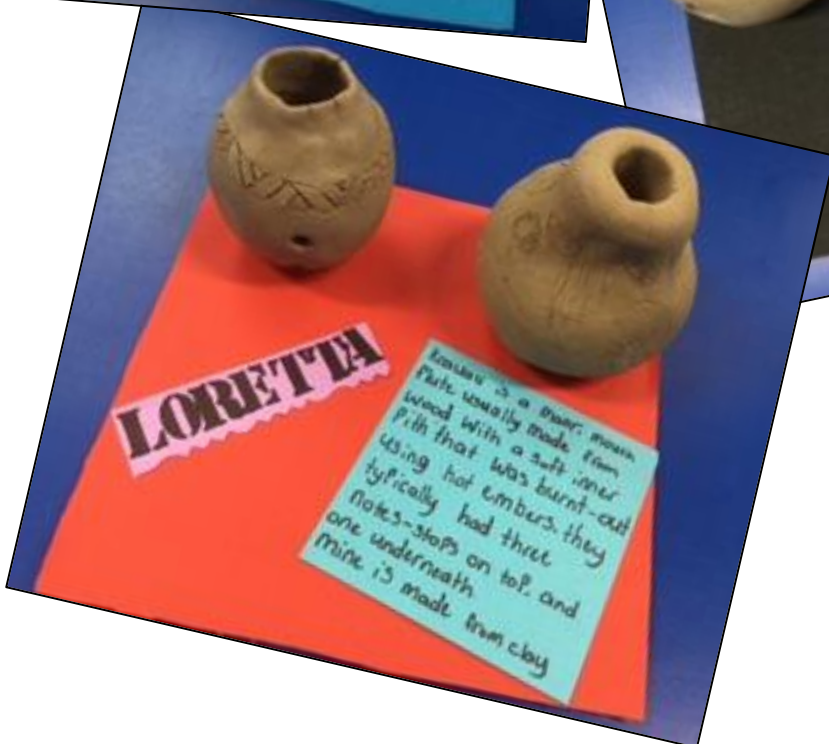
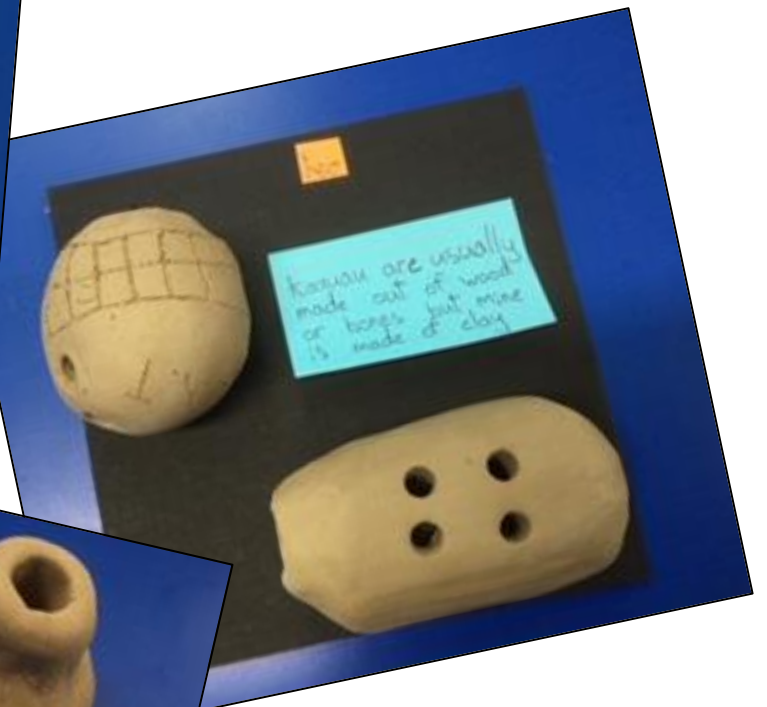
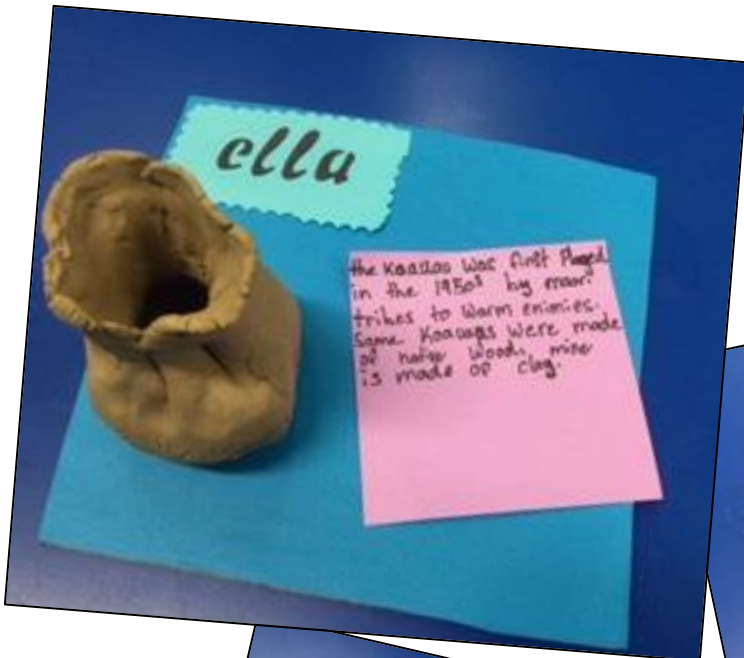
